The community once had several sawmills, a dredge, box factory, two grocery stores and a grist mill, and was the site of the first Grant County Fair. Organizers are seeking family stories and other help for this project,

which will preserve local history. Information on businesses, families, school events or anything else that would be of interest to readers is welcome.

Organizers plan to meet every couple of weeks to discuss local events and potential items for inclusion in the book. Anyone interested is welcome to attend.

The deadline for submitted material for the book is May 1, so the book can be edited and sent to the printer by next fall and ready to sell.

Oct. 11, 1919 - Feb. 23, 2016

John Radinovich, 96, of Hines, OR passed away peacefully on February 23. John was born on October 11, 1919 to John and Mary Radinovich in Crosby, MN. He was the third of 9 children.

At the age of 19 he moved to Mill City, NV and started working in the underground tungsten mines. He then went to Alaska where he worked on mining gold in the open pits and underground mining chrome. His next job was in Haines Alaska to build the Haines cutoff which joined the Al Can highway then on to White Horse Canada and worked on the oil line in Norman Wells.

In 1945 he went to work for Edward Hines in Seneca starting with the two man electric chain saw powered by a D4 cat. Then went to the two man 12 horse Diston. In 1962 he went to the one man power saw.

While in Seneca he met the love of his life Grace Lohf. They were married Sept 3, 1946 in Burns. They had 3 children Kerry John, Kristie and Kevin. They were married for 57 years, until Grace passed away in 2003. He moved to Burns in 1966 where he retired from Edwards Hines in 1982 after 35 years of falling timber. John loved to camp, hunt, ride snowmobile and motorcycles and travel. He loved being with family and friends more than anything, visiting, and having a good meal. He went to the local health club and lifted weights until he was 93.

John is survived by brothers Andy of Canyon City and Paul of Deerwood, MN. Daughter Kristie (Mike) Thornton of Meridian, ID, son Kevin (Cheryl) Radinovich of Hines, grandsons, Jason (Stacey) Radinovich and Matt (Stephanie) Radinovich of Hines, granddaughters Heather (Vade) Bailey of Burns, Tiffany (Nate) MacRostie of Bend, great-grandsons Zach and Zane Bailey of Burns, Mason and Logan Radinovich of Hines, Brayden and Isaac MacRostie of Bend.
