Notice of Revenue Bond Authorization

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council of City of Prairie City, Grant County, Oregon (the "City"), adopted Resolution No. 2016-01 on March 9, 2016, authorizing the issuance of wastewater revenue bonds. The bonds will be issued to finance capital construction and improvements to the City's wastewater system (the "Project").

The City Council may establish by subsequent resolution all terms, conditions and covenants regarding the bonds and the revenues which are necessary or desirable to effect the sale of the bonds.

The City estimates that the bonds will be issued in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$1,905,700; bond principal and interest are expected to be paid from City Revenues. The bonds will not be general obligations of the City, nor a charge upon its tax revenues, but will be payable solely from the revenues, including wastewater system revenues, which the City pledges to the payment of the bonds.

If written petitions, signed by not less than five percent (5%) of the City's electors, are filed at the Office of the City Recorder on or before May 16, 2016 (the 61st day after the date of publication of the notice), the questions of issuing the revenue bonds shall be placed on the ballot at the next legally available election date.

The Office of the City Recorder is located at 133 S. Bridge Street, Prairie City, Oregon.

The resolution authorizing the bonds is available for inspection at the Office of the City Recorder.

The bonds will be issued and sold pursuant to Oregon Revised Statutes 287A.150 et. seq.; this Notice is published pursuant to ORS 287A.150(4).
