




# John Day colder than normal during March

Blue Mountain Eagle

PENDLETON — According to preliminary data received by NOAA's National Weather Service in Pendleton Oregon, temperatures in John Day averaged slightly colder than normal during the month of March.

The average temperature was 40.6 degrees which was 1.1 degrees below normal. High temperatures averaged 52.5 degrees, which was 1.8 degrees below normal. The highest was 64 degrees on March 20. Low temperatures averaged 28.6 degrees,

which was 0.5 degrees below normal. The lowest was 21 degrees, on March 26.

There were 23 days with the low temperature below 32 degrees.

Precipitation totaled 1.13 inches during March, which was 0.14 inches below normal. Measurable precipitation — at least .01 inch was received on nine days with the heaviest, 0.37 inches reported on March 6.

Precipitation this year has reached 2.32 inches, which is 0.68 inches below normal. Since October, the water year precipitation at John Day has been 4.83 inches, which is 1.75 inches below normal.

The highest wind gust was 46 mph which occurred on March 1.

The outlook for April from NOAA's Climate Prediction Center calls for above normal temperatures and near normal precipitation. Normal highs for John Day rise from 57.0 degrees at the start of April to 64.0 degrees at the end of April. Normal lows rise from 31.0 degrees to 36.0 degrees. The 30-year normal precipitation is 1.39 inches.


#### Lola O'Rorke-Kastl
