Rita Monahan was a former associate professor at OHSU who died of colon cancer in 1999 and requested, instead of a memorial service, money be donated to a scholarship fund to assist graduating students with paying for their RN licensure examination. Her hus-

band, Greg Monahan, EOU professor emeritus of history, is matching up to \$1,500 in donations made to the Rita Monahan Scholarship this year.
