HEPPNER — BEO Bancorp and its subsidiary, Bank of Eastern Oregon, reported its first quarter earnings for 2016.

The bank announced consolidated net income of \$782,000, or 64 cents per share, during the first quarter, compared to \$470,000, or 39 cents per share for the first quarter of 2015.

Total assets were \$352.3 million, up 3.7 percent

year over year. Net loans of \$284 million were up 3.8 percent from the same period in 2015, while deposits were at \$312.3 million, up 3.4 percent year over year.

"2016 is off to a strong start," said President and CEO Jeff Bailey in a press release. "We are seeing managed growth in both loans and deposits."

Chief Operations Officer Gary Propheter said steady growth in loans and deposits bodes well for the company's brand of banking.

"I compliment our branch and loan office personnel for

providing the kind of service our customers want and deserve," he said.
