**Iron Man Shoot returns May 28**

Contest includes three shooting disciplines

PRAIRIE CITY — The Canyon Creek Bowhunters club is sponsoring the third annual Iron Man Shoot on Saturday, May 28, at the Bear Creek Shooting Range.

Teams and individuals, including youth and adults, compete in three shooting disciplines: .22 silhouette,

clay target shotgun and 3-D archery.

Last year, the contest drew 25 participants, and this year organizer Mike Springer hopes to attract 60-100 participants from across the state. The event features a novelty archery shoot, creative 3-D targets and a traditional and compound 3D course.

There will be cash prizes, as well as raffle prizes.

The cost to enter with a preregistration is \$25 for adult individuals, \$55 for three-person adult teams and \$10 for youth individuals and \$25 for a team. After May 20,

the price for each individual or team entry goes up by \$5. Registrations will also be accepted the day of the event.

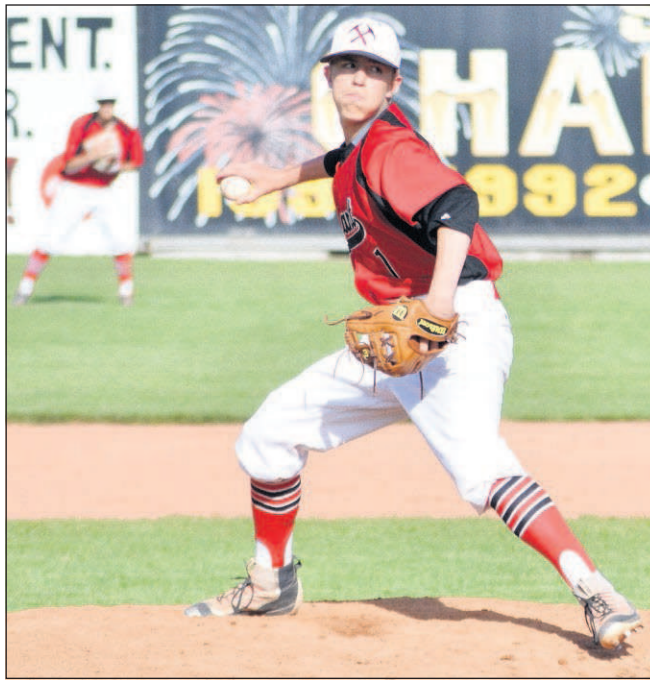

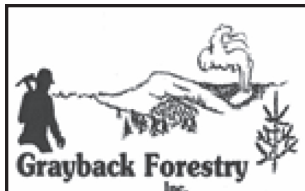
Grant Union fell to Burns 10-0 on Tuesday, April 26, in John Day. Delaney said they learned

**Gehley one stroke away from first in Enterprise**

GU golfers set sights on district meet

ENTERPRISE — Grant Union golfer Nathan Gehley was one stroke away from first place at last Friday's competition in Enterprise.

Gehley, a senior, shot 83 behind Heppner's Logan Grieb who placed first with 82.

Grant Union head coach Ron Lundbom said he's impressed with the results of Gehley's hard work over the past four years.

"He only missed it by one stroke," Lundbom said

Grant Union's Duane Stokes scored 95.

The Heppner boys won the team event with a score of 382, followed by Enterprise with 404 and Wallowa with 449.

For the girls, Heppner won first with 428, and Enterprise placed second with 491.

Sophie Grant of Heppner was low medalist with an 85.

For Grant Union, Tiana Allen scored 99, and Rose Vandehey had 134.

Now the golfers look forward to the district golf meet at Pendleton Country Club on Sunday through Tuesday, May 8 through 10.

The top two teams and top five individuals will advance to the state championships.

"We'll practice hard this week," Lundbom said.
