"Most ditches are full, and a tree was down, up the road," he said late Saturday afternoon, noting the hail had switched over to rain.

imately 75 Oregon Trail Electric Consumers Cooperative customers experienced a power outage Saturday afternoon, but had it restored about one hour later.

An OTEC official said wind from the thunderstorm likely played a role in the outage.

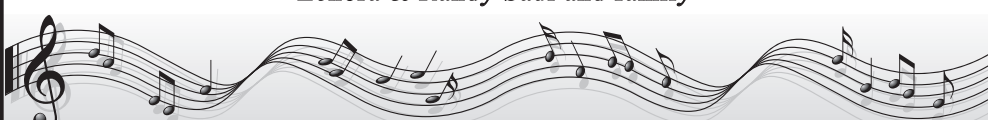

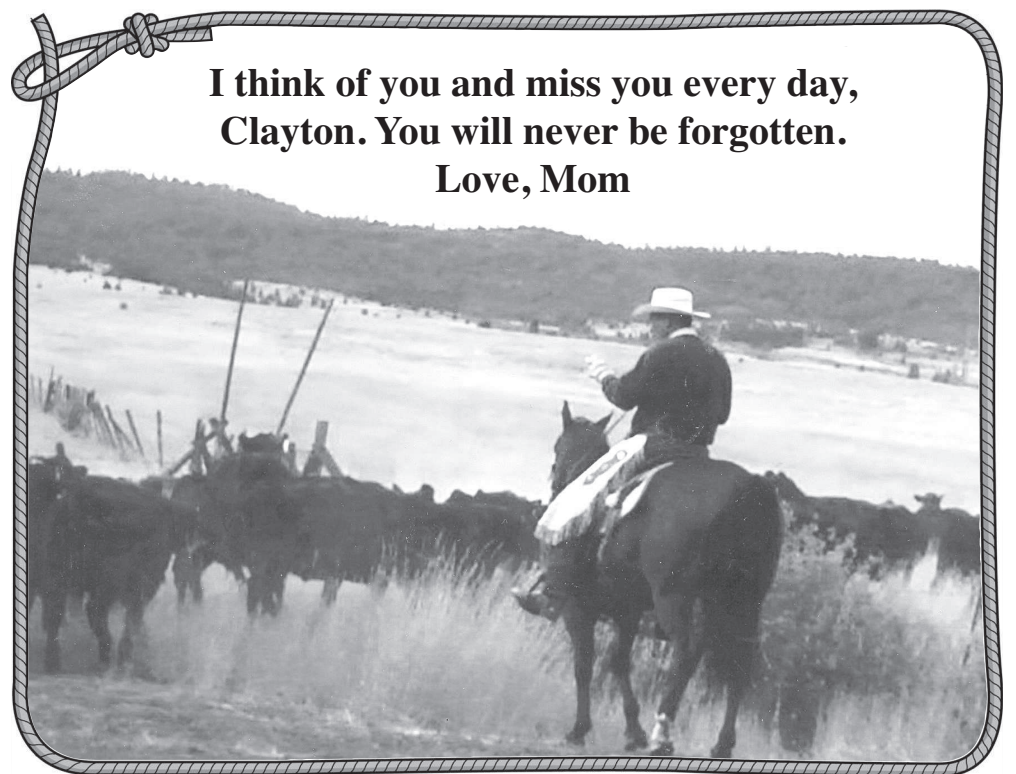
