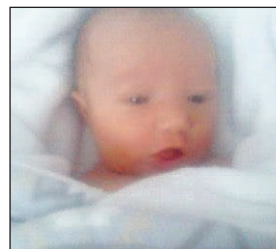

Oregon Trail Electric Cooperative customers are receiving fraudulent phone calls.

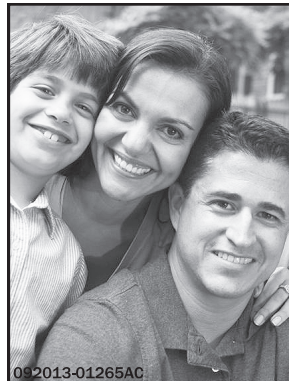

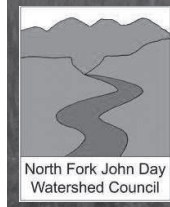
