Monument, Dayville take on 18 teams at Nike Sherman Invite

Monument and Dayville track athletes faced challenges head on, competing with 17 teams Saturday at the Nike Sherman Invitational in Moro.

It was Monument track athlete Sophie Pettit's day to shine, finishing first in three events and second in another.

Pettit set a personal record in long jump, finishing first at 16-05.50 out of 34 other competitors, increasing her mark by 3.5 inches. She also set season records in her other events, placing first in triple jump with 33-02.00, first in the 100 with a time of 12.78 and second in the 200 at 27.51.

Other Monument girls setting personal records for the day included Miranda

Cook in the 300 hurdles and javelin, Faythe Schafer in discus and the 400, Kyla Emerson in the 100 hurdles and Aubrey Bowlus in javelin.

For the Monument boys, Jess Hoodenpyl set a personal record in the 800, and Hayden Schafer set a season record in shot put.

Monument will next compete at the High Desert League Twilight Meet in Prairie City at 4 p.m. Thursday and the Baker Invite at 10 a.m. Friday.

Dayville's sole athlete competing, Gabe Walker, set a personal record in the 100 meter.

Dayville competed at the Grant Union Small Schools Meet on Tuesday past press time. They will also compete in Thursday's meet in Prairie City.


The teams will also both compete at the Friday, May 12, District 4 Track Meet in Baker City. The State Championships are scheduled for May 18-19 in Eugene.

Hallgarth was on the mound at the bottom of the inning, making quick work getting the outs, including a strikeout.

When Heppner threatened in the second — scoring one, loading the bases and scoring another on a walk — Grant Union head coach Dusty Williams made a pitching change.

Billy Copenhaver took over at the mound, and Heppner scored one more runner before the Prospectors got the outs, catching a fly ball, and getting runners out at second and first.

Grant Union's bats were cracking in the fourth, Jesse Paulson, Cauby Weaver, Wade Reimers and Ty McDaniel hitting singles and Warner Robertson hitting a double. Weaver scored on Copenhaver's sacrifice fly, and three other Prospectors scored in the inning, bringing their lead to 8-3.

Prospector Brogan McKrola pitched the fourth and fifth innings, holding the visitors scoreless for the remainder of the game.

In the top of the fifth, McDaniel's single brought in Weaver and McKrola, and Reimers' single sent Copenhaver and Hunt home. Reimers scored off Boethin's sacrifice fly.

Grant Union won by the 10-run rule after Heppner was unable to make a comeback in the bottom of the inning.

"The win was great," Boethin said afterward, adding he hoped they would have a repeat on Saturday (April 29) against Union/Cove. "We worked really hard today, and I

like to see that." Coach Williams said he wanted to keep the momentum going, and that's just what they did.

The Prospectors had an 8-3 win over Union/Cove in game one Saturday, and Grant Union ended game two in five innings with an 11-1 victory.

Zack Deiter threw a complete game one, and Brogan McKrola was on the mound for game two with 13 strikeouts in five innings, also pitching a complete game.

"With defense, we played really good as a team and capitalized on some errors made by Union," Williams said. "We hit the ball really well."

Lead-off hitter Ty McDaniel hit a single-run homer in game one.

"That was his first home run of the year," Williams said. "Ty did a great job catching for us. It's a lot of work, and he's done that all season."

Williams said he's glad to see his team playing good baseball to end the season on a good note.

"I'm just proud of the boys," he said. "It's nice to see all the hard work and the long hours they put in at the field paying off for us."

Grant Union was scheduled to face the Burns Hillanders on the road Tuesday, past press time, for a nonleague single game.

The junior varsity team hosts Vale for a doubleheader at 2 p.m. Wednesday.
