"I was a strip mine inspector for five years, and before that I worked for six years around coal mines," he said.

Knight said he left the mining industry for music.

"If I don't do it now, I'm never going to do it," he said of his thought process.

He feels coming into the music industry later in life has made him more independent. He said if he came into the industry at a younger age he likely would have done anything anyone told him to.

"That might be one of the reasons why I wasn't a com-

mercial success, because I wasn't willing to do everything everybody wanted me to do," Knight said.

Knight's music celebrates hard-working, rural Americans, something the Monday night crowd thoroughly appre-

His influences and interests include artists such as John Prine, Steve Earle, Jackson Browne and Lynyrd Skynyrd.

"If it's good music, I listen to it," he said. "I wouldn't walk across the road to hear myself play, if you want to know the truth.'

Venue owner Jesse Madden said they sold roughly 300


tickets to the Monday night show.

"Our max is 400, but 300 is a good number for us," Madden said.

He said the crowd was a great audience, and at times they were singing along louder than Knight.

They plan on hosting shows in the future but don't have anyone booked at the moment. John Day's remoteness is one of the biggest issues with getting someone to play, he said.
