Out of a pool of 297 participants, ages 8 to 13, in the preliminaries,

32 competed at Humbolt. Sinking the most free-throw shots were six winners, who will advance to the Jan. 20 district championships at Barnes Butte Grade School in Prineville.

"It was very successful," said Elks

Hoop Shoot chairman Dan Driscoll. He said several volunteers sup-
