A hunter education class starts Feb. 26 at the Grant Union Junior-Senior High School library in John Day.

Classes are scheduled for Monday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings over a two-week period. Each class lasts two to two-and-a-half hours.

A field day live shoot is planned for 9 a.m. Saturday, March 10, at the law enforcement shooting range on Halls Hill west of Prairie City.

No one under the age of 18 may hunt wildlife (except on their own land) without successfully completing this course. All ages planning to hunt as non-residents in other states may be required to have a Hunter Education Card.

ODFW has established a \$10 class fee per student. This fee may be waived in some circumstances. Pre-enrollment is available at Ace Hardware, True Value Hardware, the local ODFW office or other ODFW license sales outlets.

To register online, visit dfw. state.or.us/education/hunter and click on "View/Register for a Hunter Education Course." Under "Get Started," click on the drop down menu for "Hunter/Angler ID#" and register as a new customer.

The class is sponsored by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.
