"They can throw strikes," he said. "We just had some mistakes that cost us — tough loss, but I think we should finish off this tournament with two W's."

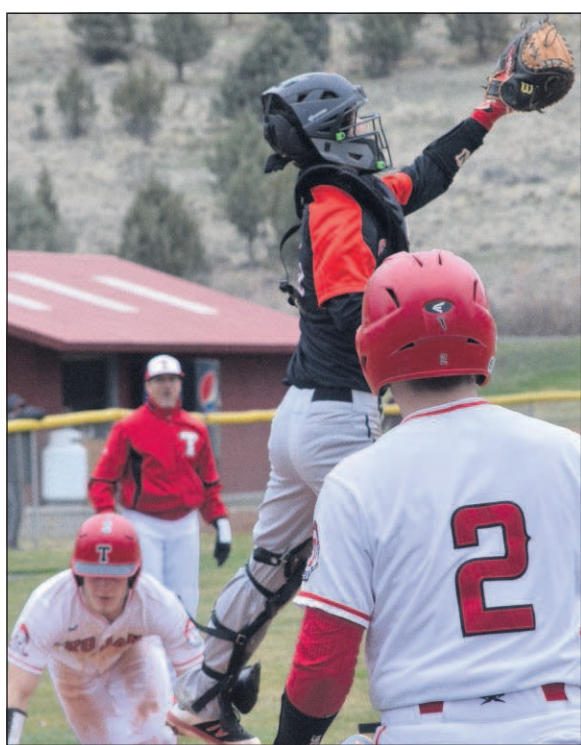
Grant Union did finish the tournament with two wins, 3-2 over Lost River Friday and 15-6 over Harrisburg Saturday.
