**Humanities grants available**

Responsive Program Grants are awarded on a rolling basis. In keeping with Oregon Humanities' commitment to making humanities programming available in communities that have historically lacked access to funding opportunities, priority for funding requests for the remainder

of the year will be given to proposals from organizations with budgets under \$500,000 that are based in and led by communities of color, rural communities and English language learners.

To apply for a Responsive Program Grant, organizations must submit an online application at oregonhumanities.org/programs/responsive-program-grants. Awards will be made until funding runs out or Sept. 30, whichever comes first.
