ted for publication.

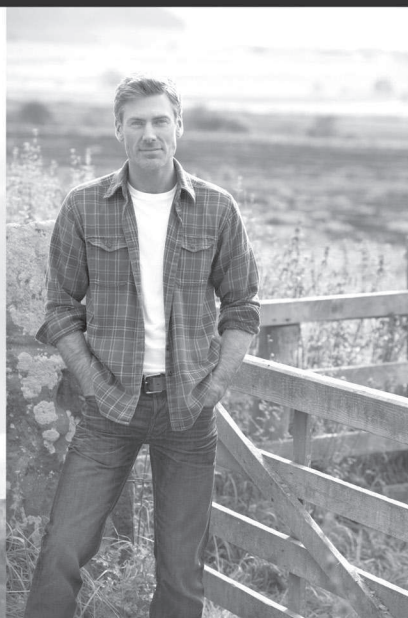
