Travis Ray Estes

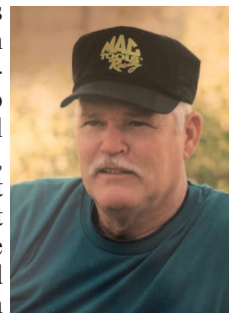
