The South Silvies Complex Grazing Allotments project preliminary environmental analysis is now available for public review and comment. The Malheur National Forest, Emigrant Creek Ranger District, is proposing to implement decisions regarding rangeland management actions on the Big Sagehen, Bridge Creek, and Silvies grazing allotments. 
