

Prospectors roll over Pioneers to even up record

Rematch with Heppner set for Thursday

Grant Union unleashed an offensive onslaught Friday in their 44-7 win over 4A Mac-Hi, evening up their record in the second game of their spring football

Jason Miller, the Pros' head coach, said the team played well in the nonleague matchup. He said they are starting to execute well.

The Pros offense blew up out of the gate with juniors Justin Hodge, Maverick Miller and sophomore Jack Strong
