LEGAL NOTICE

CLIFF KNOX PROJECT DEIS AVAILABLE FOR COMMENT

You are invited to comment on the Cliff Knox Project Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS), proposed by the Malheur National Forest – Prairie City and Emigrant Creek Ranger Districts in Grant and Harney Counties. The 40,000-acre planning area is located 30 miles southeast of Prairie City, Oregon and includes the entire Malheur River Inventoried Roadless Area and a section of the Malheur Wild and Scenic River corridor. In summary, the project proposes forest and unique habitat restoration, prescribed burning, and road activities. The Responsible Official for this project is Craig Trulock, Malheur National Forest Supervisor.

The DEIS is available on the web at <https://www.fs.usda.gov/project/?project=50433>.

The opportunity to comment on the DEIS ends 45 days following the date of publication of the notice of availability in the Federal Register, published on August 27, 2021. Only individuals or organizations who submit timely and specific written comments regarding the proposed project during a public comment period established by the Responsible Official are eligible to file an objection. For objection eligibility each individual or representative from each entity submitting comments must either sign the comments or verify identity upon request. Comments received, including names of those who comment, will be part of the public record for this project. Comments submitted anonymously will be accepted and considered but will not provide the respondent with standing to participate in an objection process or judicial review for this project.

The publication date of the notice of availability in the Federal Register is the exclusive means for calculating the comment period. Those wishing to comment should not rely on dates or timeframe information provided by any other source. It is the responsibility of all individuals and organizations to ensure their comments are received in a timely manner, within the 45-day comment period.

Electronic comments must be submitted as part of the actual e-mail message or as an attachment in Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx), rich text format (.rtf), or portable document format (.pdf) only and sent to: [comments-pacificnorthwest-malheur-prairiecity@usda.gov](mailto:comments-pacificnorthwest-malheur-prairiecity@usda.gov). E-mails submitted to other e-mail addresses, in other formats, or those containing viruses will be rejected. An automated response should confirm receipt of your electronic comment. It is the sender's responsibility to ensure timely receipt of comments.

Only individuals who submitted written comments specific to the project during the previous scoping period or during this 45-day comment period for the Cliff Knox Draft Environmental Impact Statement will have standing to file an objection (36 CFR 218.7).

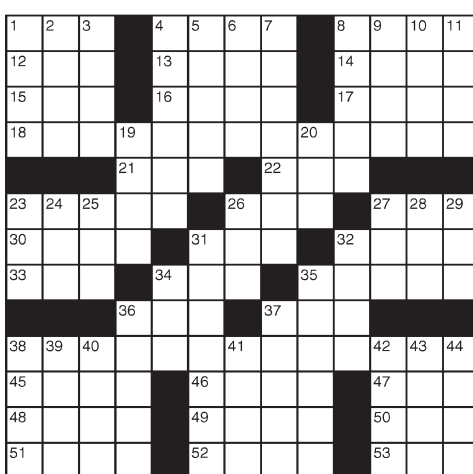
