SUMPTER — With a flea market, train rides and an outdoor concert, Sumpter is serving up lots of activity for Labor Day weekend. Masks are required indoors and outdoors in large gatherings.

FLEA MARKET

The traditional holiday weekend flea market runs from Friday through Monday, Sept. 3-6. Vendors will set up along the main street of town as well as at the fairgrounds.

CONCERT

Special this year are two performances of In a Landscape: Classical Music in the Wild, featuring pianist Hunter Noack. He will set up his piano at the Sumpter Dredge for outdoor concerts Friday and Saturday, Sept. 3 and 4, both at 5:30 p.m.

Tickets are free for Baker County residents, or \$30 for nonresidents. An extra add-on is a ride with Noack aboard the Sumpter Valley Railroad for \$25. The train leaves McEwen Depot at 4:30 p.m. both days. Reservations are required.

TRAIN RIDES

The Sumpter Valley Railroad will take visitors on short runs Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 4 and 5, beginning and ending at the Sumpter Station.

"The short runs give everyone an opportunity to ride the train,

go to the flea market, grab a corn dog, visit the Trading Post and all the other fun events that weekend," said Kim Svaty of the SVRR. The train departs Sumpter at 11 a.m., 12:30 p.m. and 2 p.m. Fares are \$18.50 adults, \$15 for seniors and military, \$10 for ages

3-17, and free for 2 and younger. Masks are required.
