

JASON HARDRATH FEATURED IN 'JOURNEY TO 100'

BAKER CITY — Jason Hardrath's mission to summit 100 peaks faster than anyone before is the story of the film "Journey to 100," which will be screened at 6:30 p.m. Saturday, June 4, at Churchill School, 3451 Broadway St. (enter through the parking lot on 16th Street). Admission is \$5, and proof of vaccination or a negative COVID test is required.

In 2020, Hardrath set out to climb 100 Washington peaks in 50 days — known as the Bulger List. "Journey to 100" documents that challenge, following Hardrath on all of his weekend excursions. The film was produced by Athletic Brewing Company and WZRD Media.

An Ironman athlete, Hardrath was ejected from a vehicle in a rollover accident in 2015. He broke nine ribs, shredded his ACL and LCL and suffered a collapsed lung. Doctors told him he'd likely never run again.
