North Powder Huckleberry Festival expands to two days

NORTH POWDER — This year's edition of the North Powder Huckleberry Festival is expanding to two days, July 30-31, plus an extra night event on Friday, July 29, to kick off the weekend.

That first offering is a movie night at North Powder School's field, sponsored by the North Powder Public Library. The film, "Journey to the Center of the Earth," begins at 9 p.m. Concessions will be available, and everyone is encouraged to bring chairs, blankets and bug spray.

SATURDAY, JULY 30

At 8 a.m., more than 50 vendors — both craft and food — will open at the park. The Motor Madness Car Show begins at 10 a.m. Entry is \$5 and awards are up for grabs in a variety of categories. For information on entering, call Lindsey Thompson, 541-406-8771.

The Huckleberry Festival parade begins at 11:30 a.m. Entries need to check in 10-11 a.m. The theme is "Old America," and floats can register the day of at the corner of Second and H streets.

Following the parade is the messiest of athletic feats — the mud volleyball tournament.

Entry is \$150 per team, and the tournament is limited to 10 teams — for information, call Thompson.

For those who don't like mud, the cornhole tournament also starts at noon, and the rock climbing wall opens.

The fire hall's annual tri-tip dinner begins at 5 p.m. Cost is \$17.
