inconclusive outcome of the vote in May. All of the council members signed the document and it was entered into the record at the July 26 session of the council.

A joint meeting between the JDCC Parks and Recreation board and the John Day City Council was held on Aug. 9. The parks and rec board voted unanimously to create an intergovernmental agency to oversee the pool's construction and give authorization to finance a bond.

The City Council voted to create an intergovernmental agency with JDCC Parks and Recreation and provide 50% of the construction costs of the project or \$3 million, whichever is less. The agenda item passed, with Heather Rookstool being the lone "no" vote on the council.

Rookstool said she has always been in support of a pool but has concerns regarding the cost of the project.

"I just think we need to, in the current state of our community and county's economy, look into the possibility of using the state funds they gave us to replace (Gleason Pool) and get us a pool that is functional and able to be used for swim team and lessons," she said.

Apart from the initial cost, Rookstool is concerned that the community may not be able to financially support the pool as currently proposed.

"Yes, we can get a pool for the \$2 million or close (to that amount) and grow it from there as we see where the community and country goes economically," she said.

Parks and Recreation, for its part, has been adamant that it can operate the pool as proposed without financial hardship.

reversible design where people play in opposite directions should make the entire course fun for experienced and novice golfers alike and add a dimension of interaction that golfers have never had.

"People who have never had a golf club in their hand can go out there and have a good time," Campbell said.

'The Ladies Putting Green'

The origin story of the St. Andrews Ladies Putting Club, better known as the Himalayas, was about including women in golf, much like the intention in creating Claire's Course.

Around the time of its establishment in 1867, there were few recreational sports for women beyond croquet, badminton and archery. The idea of women competing alongside men in golf was — to say the least — frowned upon.

However, women with brothers and fathers who were members of St. Andrews had little to do to pass the time when they came to St. Andrews for the summer.

Eventually, a nine-hole "miniature links" golf course was laid out, dubbed the Ladies Putting Green, outside public view. The putting green grew in popularity and, in 1867, it was established as the St. Andrews Ladies Golf Club, which was later renamed the St. Andrews Ladies Putting

GOAT CADDIES

One of the unique aspects of playing golf at The Retreat, Links and Spa at Silvies Valley Ranch are the goat caddies.

The resort's two newest caddies, Chunky and Charlie, were selected from over 300 young goats.

The purebred American range goats, set up with a custom pack, can carry up to six golf clubs, a dozen golf balls and golf tees on the resort's seven-hole course, dubbed McVeigh's Gauntlet. The course was named "Best New Golf Experience" by Golf Magazine in 2018.

Club. Campbell said Claire Owens homesteaded a couple of miles south of where Silvies' golf courses stand today.

It is believed that Owens played golf around the turn of the last century on a course owned by fellow homesteader Miles McVeigh. A seven-hole course at Silvies is named after him.

In addition to the belief that Owens was the first woman to play golf in the Silvies Valley, Owens was a member of the Silvies School Board. Campbell said legend has it that she might have coached Silvies' golf team.

Campbell said when one looks at the records of who settled what pieces of land in the area, it is difficult to find information about the women.

Here's how that compares with prior years:

- 2016: 106 animals, \$170,010.30
- 2017: 122, \$198,895.56
- 2018: 115, \$220,204.40
- 2019: 118, \$277,564.50
- 2020: 114, \$302,623.50
- 2021: 126, \$505,545.00

One reason last year's auction brought in more money, Springer said, likely had to do with the extraordinary support shown to Tate Waddel, who

donated the proceeds of his market steer from the Youth Livestock Auction to Blue Mountain Hospital's Rehabilitation Services Department.

Waddel was diagnosed with cerebral palsy and requires regular physical therapy. His parents, Wade and Simmie Waddel, said because of the local hospital's growing rehabilitation facility and the pediatric experience of its physical therapists, they no longer have to make trips to Bend every two weeks for their son's care.

The idea, Simmie said, was to pay it forward by donating

the proceeds of the sale of Tate's market steer. The community responded enthusiastically and the steer netted over \$30,000 at auction, with the winning bid coming from John Day-based logging company Iron Triangle.

This year, Tate donated the nearly \$13,000 brought in by his steer — donated by the Loop Ranch — to the John Day nonprofit grief center, Thadd's Place.

Springer, who has been the committee's treasurer for just under a decade, said the turn-out for this year's auction was "mind-boggling," as is the generosity of those who show up to

support the kids each year.

This year's Dely Officer Memorial Award went to Carson Weaver. The award is given each year to a 4-H or FFA student who displays outstanding courtesy and sportsmanship.

Scott Officer, who presented the award, said the nominees are interviewed by a panel of judges and the winner is presented with a pocket knife and a trophy that carries a hunter safety message.

Officer said the award is in memory of his "brother and best friend" Dely, who was accidentally shot by a hunter in 1984.
