Continued from Page 1 harbormaster's office and shower building stands at the entry and new lights and other improvements have been made.

"OK. What is the dream? This town has changed and this is not a realistic assessment of what we should do," Mayor Henry Balensifer said, pointing to the urban renewal master plan created a decade ago. "We need to plot a new path."

The entire county is short on housing, especially low-income housing, he pointed out. Putting that housing in an area that's a short stroll to parks, the library, city services and a struggling albeit tiny downtown is ideal.

"That's what urban renewal is all about -- increasing that livability."
