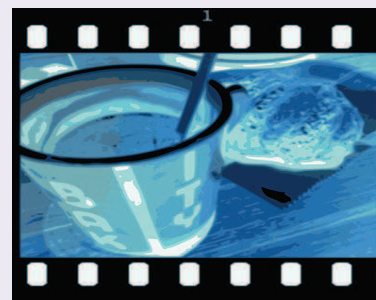

The haunted house is from 6 to 9 p.m. at Sunset Pool, 1140 Broadway, Seaside.

Admission is \$2 per person or two cans of food. Those younger than 3 are free.

Donations go to the South County Food Bank. Admission paid at either event is good for both.

- **Bats, Spiders and Owls, Oh My!** is the place to learn fascinating facts about our region's night creatures. The free event at Fort Clatsop includes crafts, puppets, non-spooky stories (including one in Spanish) and a quarter-mile walk through the forest.
