

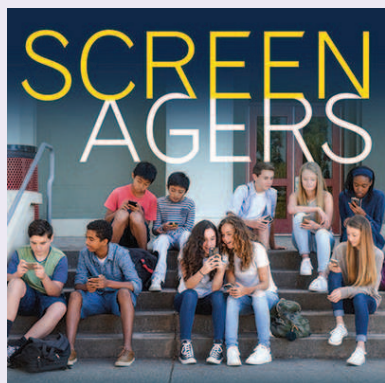
This Weekend
