Gallery hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays and 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturdays.

Gallery visitors are invited to cast a vote for their favorite piece in the show anytime throughout the duration of the

exhibit. Ballots will be tallied at the close of the exhibition and the winner will receive the People's Choice Award.
