The state Department of Fish and Wildlife determined that Feb. 17-18 would be the first of four free fishing weekends.

The others are June 2-3, Sept. 1-2 and Nov. 23-24.

No license, tag or endorsement will be required to fish, crab or clam anywhere in Oregon that's open to fishing, crabbing or clamming. All

other regulations apply, including closures, bag limits and size restrictions.

"Free fishing weekends are a great opportunity for friends and families to get out and enjoy a day or two of fishing," said Mike Gauvin, ODFW recreational fisheries manager. "Winter steelhead, trout, crabbing and clamming are just some of the great opportunities available."
