Disagrees with plan to destroy flood structure

I'm responding to last week's story on the fish passage specialist who spoke at the last Warrenton City Commission meeting.

I've never opposed fish passage as a goal for any waterway. However, I oppose future uncontrolled flooding along waterways that have structures that could be used to control flooding.

Since 1963, property owners adjacent to the Skipanon River south of the Eighth Street flood control structure had never experienced serious flooding such as was seen in December 2015 because the structure was operating the way it was designed.

If what happened is the worst that will be experienced in the city limits for the next 10 years, then I would agree there is little serious risk of flood damage caused by removing the tide gates.

Unfortunately, my crystal ball is no better than anyone else's. I cannot tell if there will be worse flooding in the future. I only know that what happened in December 2015 had not happened since before 1963, if even then.

Commissioners are reckless in taking no action to challenge the tide gate removal despite the past 50 years of flood risk control it provided.

Warrenton City Commission should take no vote on removing the flood control structure as CREST and the Skipanon Water Control District would like them to, without first holding a public workshop, publicized at least a week in advance, so that all interested parties can attend and state their cases.
