

## Walmart sets up hiring center

Walmart set up a temporary hiring center in Astoria and is in the process of interviewing workers to fill 300 associate positions.

“With the talented individuals in Warrenton, we are going to build one great Walmart team,” store manager Kimberly Smith said. “I am very excited to get started with the opening of our Hiring Center.”

The center is open 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays 422 Gateway Ave., Suite 100.

Interested applicants may also apply online at careers.walmart.com.

The store is hiring full- and part-time employees, with most beginning work in April to help prepare the store for its grand opening in June.

Walmart has hired more than 194,000 veterans, including more than 1,600 in Oregon, since launching its Veterans Welcome Home Commitment in May 2013.

The commitment guarantees a job offer to any eligible, honorably discharged veteran who has separated from active duty since 2013.

hensive plan (a timeline for funding major city improvements such as roads and parks) both are based on the visioning plan.

“The city went to a lot of time and money to develop the visioning plan and, because one commissioner didn’t like it, it sat on the shelf,” Mayor Pro Tem Rick Newton said.

### MAIN STREET

“The No. 1 thing that gets brought up at the Mayor’s Coffee is nuisance complaints,” Balensifer said of the Monday morning sessions in which the public is welcome to sit and discuss issues with him.

A task force led by Commis-

sioner Tom Dyer could work on small but visible projects that would have a big impact.

“It would be a fun thing, not a point-your-finger at someone,” Dyer said.

### EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

“It’s the personal responsibility of our citizens to be prepared,” Balensifer said. “The government is not going to build their go-bags for them.”

Warrenton’s residents and visitors should be prepared for major storms such as the one in 2007, an earthquake, a levy breach or a tsunami, commissioners agreed.

One goal is to ensure every home is offered an evacuation packet that includes tsunami maps and yes-no cards,

signs to place in windows to let rescue workers know whether you’re OK.

“There’s a lot of energy right now,” Tiffany Brown, the county’s director of emergency management, told commissioners.

“Make encouraging citizens to be your goal.”

The Beginning Fund Balance is being increased by \$23,155 to reflect actual vs. estimated beginning fund balance and increases materials and services by the same amount. This change also decreases contingency from \$49,909 to \$0 and increases materials and services by the same amount to allow for additional spending authority of \$73,064 in the Building Division Fund.
