## Annual trail run series begins Saturday at Fort Clatsop

The annual Lewis & Clark Trail Run series begins Saturday, March 31, and will be held on the Kwis Kwis Trail.

The idea behind the series is for people to get out and enjoy Lewis and Clark National Park's trails, which run through forest landscapes. It's done in a friendly race atmosphere.

The event is open to walkers and runners of all ages and they can select either 5-kilometer or 10-kilometer routes.

The 10-K run includes some long steep sections.

The start and finish lines are at the Fort-to-Sea Trail trailhead off Fort Clatsop Road.

Participants should register at the Fort Clatsop Visitor Center between 9 and 9:30 a.m. The cost to participate is a \$20 annual park pass, which grants entry into all National Parks.
