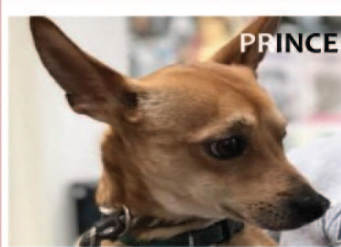

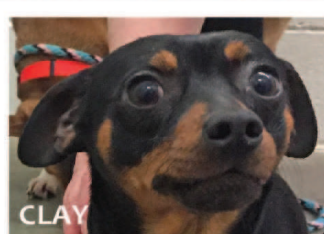

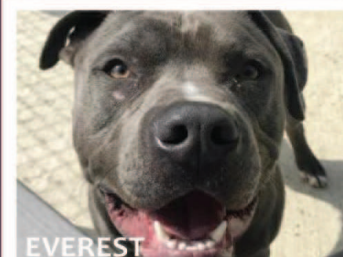

mond man who was attacked and injured by a bull while walking to his mailbox. The bull had been the culprit of several aggressive actions in the days before the attack, Warwick said.

Charging the mayor's wife was one, Warrenton Police Sgt. Jim Pierce added. "And he charged my patrol car."

The elk was killed humanely.

Pierce described another dangerous elk-human interaction at Robinson Community Park near the grade school. The call came in as "Kids being charged by an elk," Pierce said.

After interviewing all parties, it was discovered the children had been harassing the elk, he said.

In the past three years -- since Pierce has been with the department -- there have been 49 elk calls received through the dispatch center.

"The majority have mainly been elk blocking roads, elk being in people's yards and elk damaging property," Pierce said. "There were just a few that had any merit."

Noting the growing problem, a couple of years ago the city passed a law making it a crime to feed elk and other wildlife.

"We've caught several people within our own community feeding elk," Pierce said. "Some turn around later and make a complaint that they're having problems with the elk."

There are an estimated 6,000 elk in the Saddle Mountain Unit, with 125 elk in the Warrenton-Fort Stevens area, Biederbeck said. Add in Clatsop Plains and the Lewis and Clark Valley and there are more than 500 local elk.
