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number who said they wanted to be part of the team – 60 or 70,” Jannusch said.

Coaches Heidi Lent and Dionne Marshall, both middle school teachers, and Dianna Widdows, the grade school’s librarian, helped get the kids ready for several challenges.

The remotely operated vehicles they built were used to complete three underwater missions: locating airplane

wreckage, deploying equipment to monitor earthquakes and installing renewable energy devices or wind turbines.

It’s all in the name of making science and technology relevant and exciting to students and giving them real-world skills.

Each team also had to develop a business plan with a marketing poster, present it to the judges and answer

questions as if their company were vying for a job contract.

“We’re extremely proud, but also surprised,” Coach Lent said. “The whole machine we were doing was totally problematic until the day we competed. And we had no pool/underwater practice time.”

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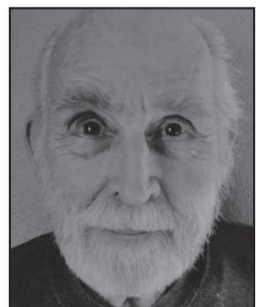
