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National Park: Local site boosted economy

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highest direct contribution, with \$5.5 billion in economic output to gateway economies and 49,000 jobs.

The restaurant sector received the next greatest direct contribution, with \$3.7 billion in economic output to local gateway economies and 60,500 jobs.

About 33 percent of park visitor spending was for lodging and camping, followed by food and beverages, 27.5 percent; gas and oil, 12 percent; souvenirs and other expenses, 10 percent; admissions and fees, 10 percent; and local transportation, 7.5 percent, according to the 2017 report.

Report authors also produce an interactive tool that enable users to explore visitor spending, jobs, labor income, value added, and output effects by sector for national, state, and local economies.

Users can also view year-by-year trend data. The interactive tool and report are avail-
