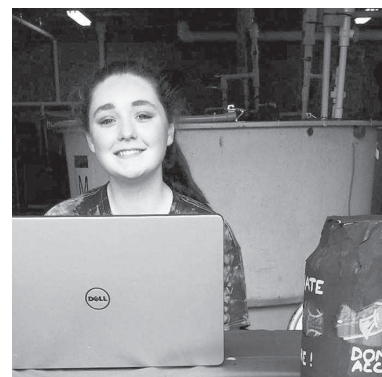

tinue doing while also pursuing his goal of becoming a diesel mechanic.

The program is in the process of being categorized as a STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) class, which could bring additional funding to the high school. STEM classes are meant to bring real-world experience and job training for students who may not be college-bound.
