Scientist to speak on Beeswax Shipwreck

Anthropologist and author Scott Williams will speak on the search for the Beeswax Shipwreck at 1 p.m. Saturday, July 14, in the Community Room at Seaside Public Library, 1131 Broadway.

The wreck and all the beeswax and artifacts that have washed ashore on Nehalem Beach are among the most popular mysteries of the Oregon Coast.

The probable source has been identified by various researchers as either a Chinese or Japanese junk, a Spanish galleon, a Portuguese trader or a lost English or Dutch pirate vessel. Recent investigations have determined the ship was likely the Santo Cristo de Burgos, a 17th-century galleon involved in the Manila Trade.
