nology specialist looked it over and "he's 99 percent sure it is not a transmitting type of skimmer, but a memory-only one and it would need to be downloaded."

The bank has not reported any customers who had unusual activity on their accounts because of the skimmer.

Many people would have trouble recognizing the device as a skimmer since it fit perfectly over the ATM's card reader, he said. "To fit perfectly like that and look so real, it had to have been 'spec'-ed to a millimeter."

National Guard members get wildfire training

Members of the Oregon National Guard are being trained for wildfire suppression after funds were allocated by the federal government.

Earlier this month, a group of 200 received the training at Camp Rilea.

On Monday, 200 more citizen soldiers and citizen airmen head to the public safety academy in Salem for the weeklong training.

The federal funds were allocated at the request of state officials to help prepare members of the Na-

tional Guard in case their assistance is needed to support wildland firefighting efforts this year.

The weeklong training is the same required of all public and private wildland firefighters.

Last year, 400 ONG members supported Oregon's air and ground efforts at the Chetco Bar, Blanket Creek, Horse Prairie and Milli fires.
