Great Columbia Crossing is Sunday

The 36th Great Columbia Crossing is Sunday, marking the only time pedestrians are allowed across the Astoria-Megler Bridge.

This year will be a bit different as the entire bridge will close to vehicles from 8:30 to 11 a.m. to improve security for runners.

The 10-kilometer run/walk begins at Dismal Nitch Rest Area on the Washington side and ends at the Port of Astoria.

"We encourage residents of the area to plan for this and schedule trips over the bridge

before or after the event, or on another day," the Astoria-Warrenton Chamber of Commerce wrote in a press release.

"Be creative and make this a positive experience. For example, a church with members coming in advance of the bridge closure might want to plan a breakfast before the service. Offer 'stranded travelers' something extra to do that morning by opening early, granting a late checkout time, or offering a special deal to invite them in your doors."
