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Properties: City considers changing status

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The value is needed not only to determine a sales price, but to find out whether it will require a vote of the people.

Measure 4-181, which voters approved in 2016, amended the city charter to require voter approval before the city could transfer or dispose of large tangible assets valued at \$100,000 or more in 2014 dollars.

If the value is less than the vote trigger, the sale would return to the City Commission. If greater, the sale would be put before all city voters.

For the second property item on the agenda, commissioners set a public hearing for Jan. 8 on the county's request to vacate, or abandon, platted streets within unim-

proved property it owns inside the city of Warrenton. The property is off Southwest Ninth Street west of Warrenton Grade School.

The county plans to turn the land over to the North Coast Land Conservancy, meaning it would be preserved in its natural state in perpetuity. There are no streets running

through the property, but because they've been platted for future development, the vacate action is required.

The land ultimately will be used to offset wetlands that would be impacted by a project Fort George Brewery has proposed on land within the county's North Coast Business Park near Costco.

Test: County alert ensures system works
