Projects: City develops lengthy to-do list

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Management Agency.

- Replacement of the aging and unsafe viewing dock at Carruthers Park, \$40,000 from the Quincy Robinson fund.
- Reconfigure the dog park at Carruthers Park to improve drainage and provide additional parking, \$30,000 and \$27,000 respectively.
- Improvements to water reservoirs, \$25,000. Water treatment plant filter replacement, \$1 million from reserves set aside for this purpose.
- Finish extension of 18-inch water line to Hammond, \$1.65 million through grants and low-interest loans.
- Improve Southwest Fourth Street between South Main Avenue and Southwest Alder Court, adding sidewalk, placing power lines

underground and replacing undersized water line, \$836,000.

- Install new water lines on Southeast Anchor Avenue from Harbor Drive to Southeast Third Street, \$93,000.
- Sewer utility improvements including septage screening, adding a low-pressure system (and rebuilding the road) on North Main Avenue and Northwest Seventh Place, adding five or more new pump stations, \$1.28 million.
- Upgrade recycling facility on Southwest First Street behind El Compadre Restaurant, adding security cameras, lighting and paving, \$25,000.
- Widen the intersection of Ninth Street and South Main Avenue, \$220,000.
- Improve and straighten

Southwest Second Street between Elm to Gardenia avenues, \$320,000.

- Reconstruct Southwest Alder Avenue between Second and First streets, fixing drainage issues, \$450,000.
- Upgrade curb and sidewalk by Warrenton Grade School, \$40,000.
- Install way-finding signs along trails, \$50,000.
- Replace several tide gates on Alder Creek, \$50,000.
- Purchase a new garbage truck, \$430,000
- Purchase a one-ton truck for Public Works Department, \$50,000.
- Make improvements to commercial pier at Warrenton Marina, \$382,000.
- Dredge Hammond Marina, \$840,000.
- Improvements to Tansy Point dock, \$168,500.

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
