Falcon Cove Beach Domestic Water Supply District Notice of Adoption of Ordinance 201901

On 24 May 2019, the Board of the Falcon Cove Beach Domestic Water Supply District (FCBDWSD) met at the Arch Cape Fire Station for a duly noticed Special Board Meeting at which time the FCBDWSD Board voted unanimously to Adopt Ordinance 201901 which is an Ordinance amending a prior Adopted Ordinance (201801) by adding the word "Excessive", adding clause H. = "Exceed any limitations on water use imposed by the Board", and adding the sentence:

"By majority vote, the Board may adopt policies and establish rates, charges, and penalties as needed to implement and enforce this Ordinance"
