Talk focuses on baby who accompanied Lewis & Clark

Garry Bush, a retired teacher from Lewiston, Idaho, will present "The Life and Times of Pomp: Jean Baptiste Charbonneau" during this month's In Their Footsteps free speaker series at Fort Clatsop.

"Pomp," the son of Sacagawea and Toussaint Charbonneau, accompanied the Lewis and Clark Expedition. Later, he was a legendary fur trader, traveled in Europe and was involved with the Santa Fe Trail, the Mexican War and

the California Gold Rush.

The free talk is at 1 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 18, in the Netul River Room of the Fort Clatsop Visitor Center.

Bush has given many presentations on Sacagawea's son over the years.

The monthly speaker, which is generally dark during the summer, picks up again in September with a talk on John Colter's impact on American History.

Oregon fishing is free this weekend

Fishing is free in Oregon this weekend, Aug. 17 and 18.

No fishing licenses or tags (including Combined Angling Tags or Columbia River Basin Endorsements) are required to fish, crab or clam anywhere in Oregon for both residents and non-residents.

All other fishing regulations apply including closures, bag limits and size restrictions. Trout and warm water fishing are ideal for beginners.

Crabbing is open along the entire Oregon coast. Cul-laby Lake was last stocked with trout in March, Sunset Lake in April and Coffenburg Lake in May.
