History: Little museum to close its doors

Charlotte Bergerson, one of Warrenton's other premier historians.

"There's nobody who's represented Warrenton more than she has," said County Commissioner Mark Kujala, Warrenton's former mayor. "She is Warrenton's history. She knows Warrenton's history. She celebrates Warrenton's history. She's been a true asset in the community and she's been doing it as long as I can remember."

Three decades ago, Collier and friend Pat Williams formed the Warrenton-Hammond Historical Society. In

2007, they ran a little museum in Lighthouse Park at the four-way stop owned by Deep Sea Fisherman's Benefit Association.

When Astoria-Warrenton Chamber of Commerce decided to stop staffing the visitor center in Youngs Bay Plaza in 2011, the little museum moved there.

But smart phones have killed the need for visitor centers, Collier said.

"The computer came along and ruined everything, making life easier for people," she

said wryly.

Collier must find homes for her treasures. She doubts Sonny will make room in his workshop for them.

And her retirement leaves the little building in limbo.

"The chamber doesn't really have a good use for it," said David Reid, executive director of the Astoria-Warrenton Area Chamber of Commerce. "But whatever's decided, we'll be part of that solution."

The city of Warrenton owns the building; the center's owner owns the property. If the center is abandoned, the city could be required to remove the building.

"If it's not operated as a visitor center, it does revert back to the property management company," City Manager Linda Engbretson said. "Our next step is trying to see if there's any organization who'd want to continue operating it as a visitor center."

The center will remain open from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. weekdays through September.
