

Bee Atlas project visits to Ft Clatsop

Those interested in learning more about bees or volunteering for projects that support bees are urged to attend the Oregon Bee Atlas information session from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 13, in the Netul River Room in the Visitor's Center at Fort Clatsop State Park.

Oregon has about 500 species of bees, although much of the state has been poorly surveyed. The Oregon Bee Atlas' five-year mission is to train volunteers to generate museum-quality records with a complete inventory of the bees of the state.

Andony Melathopoulos, an assistant professor in Pollinator Health Extension in the Department of Horticulture at Oregon State University, will present the talk. Melathopoulos also sits on the steering committee of the Oregon Bee Project.

The city of Warrenton has placed a lien on the title of a house on South Main Avenue in hopes of recovering costs associated with cleaning the property.

The city spent months trying to get the owner of 1180 S. Main Ave. to remove what amounted to a public nuisance because of all the junk and debris in the yard, according to a staff report.

The city sent a letter to the property owner requesting payment of \$3,067 for costs associated with an Aug. 28 cleanup. No response has been received.

The property is for sale and Louis James Burdett is listed as current owner, according to Clatsop County property records.
