
It would apply to projects in which adding a sidewalk would be awkward, such as a single improved parcel on an older street without sidewalks.

"If it doesn't connect to anything or doesn't make sense, such as they'd have to remove a large tree, that's when it would apply," City Manager Linda Engbretson said.

The developer would be charged a fee, such as \$3,700 for a typical property with a 50-foot street frontage.

The in-lieu fee would be placed in a separate fund for sidewalk construction in more appropriate parts of the city, such as along Harbor Drive.

The proposal requires a second vote at a future meeting.
