HOLIDAY OPERA, DEC. 20

North Coast Chorale presents "Amahl and the Night Visitors," a one-act opera, as well as other holiday favorites at 7 p.m. Fridays, Dec. 20, and 4 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 22, at the Clatsop Community College Performing Arts Center, 588 16th St., Astoria.

HOMETOWN 'ROCKETTES,'

DEC. 20

"The Holiday Spectacular" hosted by Encore Dance Studio begins at 6:30 p.m. Friday at the Liberty Theater, 1203 Commercial St., Astoria.

The Radio City Rockettes are the inspiration for the Warrenton dance group's performance. It's a nonticketed event, although donations will be accepted at the door for Encore Performing Arts Foundation. Doors open a half-hour before the

performance.

PLUM PUDDING, DEC. 20-23

The Flavel House Museum will have its traditional Tea and Plum Pudding event in the festively decorated museum from 1 to 4 p.m. daily Dec. 20-23 and from 1 to 4 p.m. Dec. 26-30.

Admission is \$12 for non-members and \$8 for members of the Clatsop County Historical Society. It includes warm plum pudding, hot tea and a self-guided tour of the museum. Reservations are recommended for groups of eight or more.

Ft Clatsop has after-Christmas plans

Lewis and Clark National Historical Park will offer special programs about the Corps of Discovery's winter at Fort Clatsop on the days following Christmas.

Starting Dec. 26, Fort Clatsop will feature scheduled living history programs by park rangers from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. each day through Jan. 1.

Rangers in period clothing will present flintlock muzzle-loading programs, demonstrations, talks and walks about various aspects of the explorers' winter at Fort Clatsop.

"A Clatsop Winter Story," a 22-minute movie about the 1805-06 winter from a Clatsop Indian perspective, and "Lewis and Clark: Confluence of Time and Courage," a 34-minute movie about the entire voyage, will be offered every hour.

The park is closed on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

Admission is \$7 per adult – increasing to \$10 on Jan. 1.
