Powder horns featured in next free In Their Footsteps lecture

The history of powder horns and their use during the French and Indian wars is the topic of the next In Their Footsteps lecture at 1 p.m. Sunday, March 15.

Scott Morrison, who has studied the historical uses of powder and cattle horns and built them, will lead the talk.

He has become an expert on the various periods and geographic styles and is a journeyman in the Honourable Company of Horners, a national guild which has a mission of promoting, preserving and educating the public about horn making.

The free monthly lectures are spon-

sored by the Lewis & Clark National Park Association and held in the Netul River Room of the Fort Clatsop Visitor Center.
