Man crashes after leading police on brief chase

A Milwaukie man who'd attempted to camp overnight in a city park led officers on a brief pursuit before crashing his car in the early morning hours of March 27.

Christopher C. Dahl, 61, was booked at Clatsop County Jail on suspicion of attempting to elude police, criminal mischief, three counts of reckless endangering, driving while suspended and failing to obey an executive order.

Officer Daniel Carpenter was patrolling Robinson Community Park about 1:40 a.m. when he spotted a blue Ford Mustang containing a man who appeared to be spending

the night near the baseball fields, Officer Dan Carpenter wrote in a court document.

"Christopher stated that he was driving from Portland and needed a place to rest for the night," the officer wrote.

Dahl got out of the car and handed the officer a Clackamas County inmate card, saying he'd just been released from jail. When Carpenter had dispatch run his information, it was discovered Dahl's license was suspended.

While the officer was communicating with dispatch, Dahl returned to the car, tell-

ing the officer he was trying to stay warm. But then he started the engine, put the car in reverse and drove off, according to a police report.

As other officers arrived, they were nearly struck by the Mustang and began pursuing the car. Dahl drove toward the west end of Second Street, crashed into a cement barrier at Elm Street and went into a ditch.

Dahl was able to crawl out of the vehicle and was placed under arrest. He was taken to Columbia Memorial Hospital for an evaluation before being booked at the jail.
