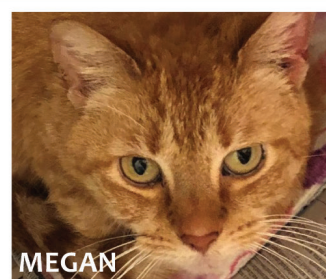

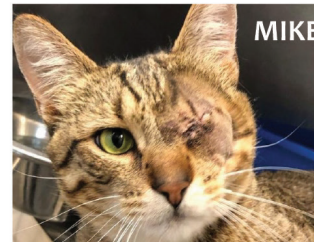

Universities win glacier study grants

A combined \$2.2 million in collaborative research grants are headed to Oregon State University and the University of Oregon.

The money will be used to study tidewater glaciers and is expected to generate key climate change data, U.S. Senators Ron Wyden and Jeff Merkley announced recently.

Sea-level rise will affect millions of people in coastal communities within the next several decades, the National Science Foundation has said. The grants will study tidewater glaciers' role in that threat.

"Comprehensive scientific studies like these on tidewater glaciers produce results that can and must be used to protect communities along the Oregon Coast, the United States and the world," Wyden said.

It's a great way to leverage OSU's strength in oceanography and robotic technologies, said Jonathan Nash, professor of Oceanography at OSU.

"These observations are a key element necessary to better predict the severity of sea-level rise driven by our changing climate," Nash said. "Never before have measurements like this been possible."
