at the scene.

The trooper has been placed on paid administrative leave pending the outcome of the investigation.

The previous week, Burns had been arrested and released twice for shoplifting attempts at Fred Meyer and Warrenton MiniMart. She

also was cited for resisting arrest during the incident at the MiniMart, where she'd taken a bottle of water and a large bottle of hard iced tea.
